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Sociology is the study of human social relations. It examines different elements of society such as organizations, cultures, social institutions, and groups that develop when people interact and work together.

Our majors explore basic institutions of society, such as family, education, religion, the economy, and government, as well as dimensions of social inequality, such as class, gender, and race.

Students have the choice of pursuing a BA or BS in Sociology allowing them the choice and flexibility to incorporate broad liberal arts foundations and an emphasis on research methods and analytic skills based upon their individual interests and goals.

#### SOCIAL WORK AND COMMUNITY SERVICE

Agencies value employees with backgrounds in fields like sociology. These students learn about social problems and the research skills to help solve them. A minor could make you the ideal candidate to focus on special populations.

#### CORRECTIONS

Probation and parole for juveniles and adults. Providing training and education to offenders.

#### **BUSINESS**

Sociology majors can specialize in human resources, advertising, and consumer research.



Students can use their analytical skills in looking at admissions data or in research centers. Human social relations skills will help in housing, counseling, or advising.

#### **HEALTH SERVICES**
